## CACTC Automotive Technology "Possessed Brake Lathe" Safety Lesson

<u>Lesson objective</u>: Given a job safety analysis (JSA) and a brake lathe demonstration, the student will compose a written, fictional, horror story that highlights *all* of the dangers of using the brake lathe, when compared to the JSA with 100% efficiency.

<u>Assignment information</u>: This is a written assignment that will help you practice proper writing technique. All of your work will be graded and all of the steps must be followed to create the final product.

## Process:

- Brain storming
- Evaluation of the demonstration, add to your notes
- Evaluation of the brake lathe job safety analysis and safety rules
- Use all of the information provided to formulate an outline using the hazards listed in the JSA as headings
  - o Begin to formulate ideas for your horror story
  - o Be as creative as possible
  - o This is fiction (Not a true story)
  - Every hazard listed in the JSA must be evident in your story to receive credit. (Example: Monday, it was Johnny's turn to machine a rotor. As he was tightening up the thumb screws on the knives, his fingers got pinched between the rotor and the knives. The lights flickered, as the machine mysteriously turned it's self on; ripping his hand from his arm.
  - o This will be evaluated and graded for completion
- Create a rough draft
  - o It is advisable to use word to create your rough draft; I will accept a hand written one.
  - o This will be evaluated and graded for content
- Once the rough draft has been checked for content, it will be returned to you
- Create your final product using word
- Submit your final draft as follows:
  - o Print yourself a copy for your portfolio
  - Submit an electronic copy to me in my student drop folder, in the correct file folder
  - o Final work will be evaluated for spelling, grammar, and format
